# From The Pastor

You'll be reading this newsletter after Easter, when we celebrate the resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ, but I write in the middle of Holy Week, and I'm meditating on the cross.

All by itself, the incarnation - that the Son of God would become one of us in the man Jesus of Nazareth - is astounding and shows the depth of love God has for us. But even more so is the cross - that the Son of God would willingly undergo the agony and humiliation of a death by crucifixion.

In a devotional I received today the writer pointed out that the Roman preferred crucifixion not for its efficiency - there are much quicker ways to execute someone - but for its theatrical cruelty that served as a warning to anyone who would dare defy Rome. The cruelty began with the condemned forced to carry his execution device through the streets where the crowds would heap insults and shame on him.

But there was a greater shame and humiliation for Jews who were crucified. Based on a passage from the Old Testament, Jews believed that anyone hung on a tree was cursed by God, forsaken and rejected by him. The Roman cross was believed to symbolize a tree, so a crucified Jew was not only being punished by the Romans but utterly rejected by God. To the people of Jesus's time, there was no more shameful end in all the world than to be crucified.

So imagine what it was like for Jesus first to carry his cross through the streets, jeered at by the people he came to save who saw Jesus as a failure, cursed by God and facing an excruciating death because he'd done something to earn God's condemnation. For Jesus the cross meant not only a torturous death but complete and utter rejection by his own people. In this way Jesus fulfilled the prophecy from Isaiah 53,

"He was despised and rejected by others; a man of suffering and acquainted with infirmity... and as one from whom others hide their faces he was despised and we held him of no account... We accounted him stricken, struck down by God and afflicted."

Yet it was our rejection of God that led us to reject Jesus Christ; it was the depth and breadth of our sin that made necessary his atoning death on the cross. This week, I'm thanking God for his son Jesus Christ, who endured the shame and agony of the cross, that I could be saved.

We are so ridiculously fortunate at Central to be inundated with talented musicians, vocalists, technicians, and servant-hearts who make worship so meaningful and rich. THANK YOU, fam! You are amazing and I know that God is pleased. Thanks be to God!!!

# WONDER

Our theme at PlaySchool Central for the 2023-2024 School Year was WONDER. We wanted to look at wonder through a child's eyes and craft our lessons and classrooms to inspire learning and wonder. Our end result was for our teachers to create a wonder map that would be used to guide our decisions in how we would spend the money raised by the spaghetti dinner fundraiser to create spaces that inspire wonder. Each classroom has around \$1000 to spend in creating a unique environment for our students. We would not be able to make such incredible changes without the support of our parents and Central. Over the next few months in the Window we will go over the other classes and their plans to transform their spaces! We will include pictures after the spaces are finished!



#### TWO YEAR OLD CLASS

Our two year old classroom is currently bright yellow, which used to be the trend in early childhood classrooms. Think bright primary colors, plastic materials, and in-depth bulletin board displays. Research has shown that bold bright colors can be over stimulating for young children and we would like to tone down the color to a light cream. The priority is to create a calm aesthetically pleasing (homelike) environment that promotes learning and wonder thru child-led play. This will be achieved through painting the walls, using natural textures, adding soft lighting, updating dramatic play and creating a wonder wall.

#### March 10th - Pancake Dinner

One of the intentions of the Youth @ Central for this year is to plan connection points for the Youth and the church members to interact. The pancake dinner was one of those events! We served 100 people and enjoyed over 10 variety show acts. The youth had a great time setting up, serving, participating in the variety show, and cleaning up. Thank you to everyone who made this possible and participated in this fun time.



#### What have the youth been learning?

Our Easter study for Sunday school was called This is Real Love, about what Jesus did to demonstrate his love at Easter. The themes of these lessons were: Jesus shows us what real love is, Jesus treats everyone like they are important, and Jesus offers everyone forgiveness. These lessons were based on the scripture 1 John 4:10. This is the kind of love we are talking about—not that we once upon a time loved God, but that he loved us and sent his Son as a sacrifice to clear away our sins and the damage they've done to our relationship with God.

Our youth group study time has been centered around a devotional book called "What If Jesus Was Serious?" This book takes a look at some of Jesus' most demanding teachings in the Sermon on the Mount and pushes us to ask whether we're hearing what Christ is saying in these passages.


