Some Information to Ponder

Did you know that each of the gospels are typically represented by an image? The four images are as follows: an ox, an eagle, a man, and a lion. Now, someone might ask, why are those particular images for these first four books of the New Testament? The gospel of Luke has the image of the ox because after the preface of this gospel, there is a reference to the priestly office of Zechariah. The ox was the sacrificial animal for the priests, so the ox was chosen to represent the Gospel of Luke. Most commentators agree that Matthew has a human symbol, because of the Gospel beginning with the Genealogy of Jesus. The gospel of Mark begins with the phrase "a voice crying out in the wilderness (Mark 1:3)," and this is the reason some scholars feel that the lion is the symbolic presence to prepare the way for Jesus at the beginning of the Gospel of Mark. Finally, the image of the eagle is thought to symbolize the Gospel of John. According to Jerome, a fourth century CE scholar, translator and theologian wrote, the gospel of John is "hurrying to the heights born aloft on Eagle's wings" to proclaim Jesus as the word of God. The preceding information came from the book, Four Gospels, One Jesus by Richard Burridge.

There is more that can be said about these symbols and how they represent the Gospel Accounts. Each Gospel has its own personality and uniqueness, just as these symbols do. So, in addition to my encouraging everyone to see the symbols on the church sanctuary doors, I am also encouraging people to read the Gospels in their entirety. It is apparent as someone reads one of the Gospels that it has it own perspective and feel to it. I could write on and on about the uniqueness that I have experienced with the Gospels, but I hope that each of you in this faith community will take the time and read the Gospels. Not only is it our primary source for information on the life and ministry of Jesus Christ, but each author adds something to the perspective of the Son of God and our savior. Blessings be on us all as we enter into a new fall season, and new church year.

Don't worry - the movie has a happy ending. But there's a scene near the beginning where Bullock's character's daughter, Bernice, is desperate to not be left by her Daddy. He has packed a suitcase, is heading to the car, and Bernice is following him with a suitcase of her own. Several times, the Dad tells her that she cannot come with him, but the little girl is persistent, attempting to put her bag in his trunk & sticking her arm inside his car window. Eventually, the Dad honks the horn to scare Bernice out of the window and drives away, leaving his family behind to start a new relationship with the formerly mentioned "best friend". After several seconds of wailing deep and guttural tears, Bernice's mom walks over, scoops her up, and carries her back to the house. I imagine that anyone who sees that scene would be absolutely heartbroken by it & I still can't believe that little girl didn't win an Oscar for her gut-wrenching performance.
