- \* She serves as a board member for the Adams Rescue Mission.

Furthermore, Juliet is a sought-after speaker, sharing her message at organizations and churches across Pennsylvania. She also speaks as part of Resilient Voices, a speakers bureau through the PA Office of Victim Advocate, hoping to impact legislation and better help victims of abuse.
