We will study God's Heart for Justice during Sunday school for the next 3 weeks. Both of these studies are powerful. When studying different scriptures, we always share how this can relate to our lives. On Feb. 25th we talked about what it means to be a peacemaker.

How do we live out being a peacemaker? Do we avoid conflict? A popular perception of peacemakers is that of weakness and avoidance. We see peacemakers as those who forego the challenging and expensive task of establishing true reconciliation in favor of the appearance of peace by repressing any visible dispute. But these are not people who promote peace. They are peace-fakers. God is not a conflict-avoider, and being so does not make us His children. Jesus created peace by fearlessly confronting evil head-on rather than denying its existence or trying to subdue its influence.
