Hope in the Midst of Despair

31 *What then are we to say about these things? If God is for us, who is against us? 32 He who did not withhold his own Son but gave him up for all of us, how will he not with him also give us everything else? 33 Who will bring any charge against God's elect? It is God who justifies. 34 Who is to condemn? It is Christ who died, or rather, who was raised, who is also at the right hand of God, who also intercedes for us. 35 Who will separate us from the love of Christ? Will affliction or distress or persecution or famine or nakedness or peril or sword? 36 As it is written,*

"For your sake we are being killed all day long; we are accounted as sheep to be slaughtered."

37 *No, in all these things we are more than victorious through him who loved us. 38 For I am convinced that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor rulers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, 39 nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus our Lord.* (Romans 8:31-39)

We will be entering this month into the period of Lent. This is a time of self-reflection, of pondering what Jesus did for all of us. Jesus took on a great burden for us, so that we might all have everlasting life. Jesus provides for us hope, with which we can use to guide ourselves through life. This hope is something we need to remember at all times.

But what about in times of sadness, somebody might ask. It is hard to see the hope in troubled times, another person might think. I do not see hope when there is conflict or problems, someone else could mutter under his or her breath. Well, it is true that hope may become more elusive when times get harder. But hope is always there. Hope is there because of the actions of God through Jesus Christ. We will face difficult times in our lives. There may have been problems and challenges for the church in the past, or even in the present, but the hope through Jesus Christ is still there. Even when there are disagreements between people, there is still hope and the opportunity for gain.

We may find ourselves at times being weighed down by our thoughts and we may lose sight of hope and the future. Just because we are distracted by our own thoughts, does not mean that hope is gone. There were times when the disciples despaired about life. Even Jesus struggled with hope and was depressed about his own future. God provides us with hope, and that hope is our light for the future. It is this hope which can point us in the right direction for the future. This hope can assist this congregation to solve the problems it encounters. This God given hope is our future after this world.

There are so many things happening in our lives, in our community and in our world right now. During this month let's spend some time praying for some of the major areas of need.

- First responders who need to be out in cold and dangerous weather to help and protect us.

CPC Kids' Ministry

We have had an interesting winter to be sure. One day it is almost 60 degrees, and the sun is shining; the next day, it is 10 degrees with a negative wind chill. The weather changes so fast that it's hard to know what to expect. I remember growing up, we could guarantee cold temperatures and plenty of snow from November to March. But things have changed, and really everything changes at some point.

On the third floor, the kids have been learning that when life changes, God is good. We followed the Israelites across the Red Sea and through the wilderness, discovering how God helped them overcome challenges and showed His goodness. When talking to the kids about this story, I explained that parts of life are always changing, but no matter what God is good. They may change schools, change friends, or change towns, but God is good through it all.

It is easy to forget or overlook this as adults. When changes are difficult or sad, we tend to despair easily. At least, I know I do. I think this is why verses like Philippians 4:13 and Joshua 1:9 are so popular. We need that encouragement to handle life's changes. After doing this unit with the kids, I want to encourage us all to praise God for His goodness in those hard, changing times as well. Quite a challenge, I know! But how wonderful for us to remember that God is good, all the time; and all the time, God is good.



A Note From Erin



I grew up watching Mr. Rogers.

For years, that beloved man spoke calmly, intentionally, and directly into a camera feed that reached millions of families. He began feeding his fish in each episode because a little girl wrote him a letter expressing concern that the fish weren't eating. He used puppets to teach lessons, wore unassuming clothing, visited every-day people doing every-day work, and always treated everyone he encountered with dignity & respect.

When he wasn't on camera, he could often be found visiting sick children in hospitals, answering letters with empathy, and sharing the good news of Jesus as a Presbyterian minister and a disciple of Christ.

I love Mr. Rogers. And I thank God that there are still people, much like him, who not only speak about their faith, but live it out.

When Mr. Rogers addressed tragedies on tv, he said, "But when we get sad and angry, you and I, we know what to do with our feelings so we don't have to hurt other people... Always look for the people who are helping... you'll always find someone who's trying to help."

These days feel very full of grief and tragedy.

So what can we do?

I think we can do four things:

1. Keep our faith and hope in Jesus. He already has the victory.
2. Look for and support the helpers. They are out there.
3. Become a helper. Use what we have, do what we can, from where we are.
4. Live out our faith. Thinking about it & talking about it is good. But to live it out... that's better.



Our Super Senior's continuing series, KNOW THY NEIGHBOR, is proud to present Rev. Dr. Andrew Hart, who currently serves as the Chaplain at Wilson College here in Chambersburg.

Academic Background

Dr. Hart attended Wake Forest University in Winston-Salem, NC, for his undergraduate studies, where he majored in Political Science and graduated Magna Cum Laude. He then earned his Master's in Political Science from the University of South Carolina. Following his masters, he was awarded a Fulbright grant to study at McGill University in Montreal.

Ministry and Scholarship

Feeling a call to serve the church, he attended Princeton Theological Seminary and went on to serve congregations in:

- Lancaster, South Carolina
- Long Island, New York
- Chambersburg, Pennsylvania

Dr. Hart holds a Doctorate of Ministry from Columbia Theological Seminary, where he focused on the overlap of PTSD and spiritual life. An accomplished writer and researcher, he has published extensively across journals and anthologies and is the author of *The Same God, Different Pulpits*.
