#### From The Pastor

Life is not always laid out perfectly. Sometimes there are change in circumstances and situations that can cause us to pause and begin to figure out what our next steps will be. And sometimes in our plans we have to be ready to face changes and even change our perspective and pivot in life.

I went through a process of pivoting recently. I had a week of vacation planned out in July, go to a concert with Noah on Tuesday and then drive on to Michigan to camp for several days with an intentional community where I had connections to a number of people there. The week before the vacation I had been dealing with some back issues. I took what I thought was the proper steps to address the pain and I thought I was on the road to recovery. My back was a little sore on the trip out to Pittsburgh where the concert was, but I wrote that off to being in a car for three and a half hours. Noah and I stayed in a hotel for the night. We had originally planned to meet Rachel the next day, have Noah travel back home with Rachel, and I would carry on my journey. The morning after the concert I found myself waking up early and in a considerable amount of pain. I had to weigh my options about making that trip to Michigan which I had been looking forward to.

I have to be honest, I can be a little stubborn sometimes. This could be something passed on through my family of origin. Over the years, I have planned all sorts of roads trips of varying lengths. I can remember one time a plan to travel with Rachel up and down the East Coast a number of years ago, and even though I happened to break my leg before the trip, we still went on that driving adventure. There have been other times when weather and other obstacles have stood in the way of plans, and I have still carried out travel plans. So, I have the past practice of completing journeys regardless of circumstances.

I took into consideration the potential challenges of the trip (7 hours in the car each way, sleeping in a tent for four days, etc.). And this time I did something different. After some serious thought I completely pivoted in my plans. Announced to Noah and Rachel that I would be returning home due to health concerns. I was very thankful that both Rachel and Noah rolled with the change of plans without a word of complaint or concern. Noah drove his car home and Rachel and I took a leisurely drive back home. And we made an impromptu visit to the Flight 93 memorial site which a moving and powerful experience. And the rest of week was filled with rest and recovery.

I believe that I have almost fully recovered from the setback with my back. I am sad that I could not make it out to the intentional community this year, but I am quite sure I know what will happen next July and where I will likely be. Sometimes we do have to pivot. It may not always be easy or comfortable to do, but I believe it is something that we have to be open to God's leading. I think this is true in our individual lives, and in our families. We may not know what life has in store for us, but we have to realize that sometimes life cannot happen the way we expect it to. Sometimes we have to pivot and alter our path. There are things in life that are out of our control. And as we live faithful lives, we plan that we can, but sometimes we have to understand what we can and cannot control. And we look to God for guidance and support as we attempt to maneuver our ways through this world. Thanks be to God, and may we understand that even in our best intentions sometimes we need to pivot.

What a delight it is to grow in faith together!! One of the ways we do that is to dig into God's Word. Each month we are highlighting a passage of Scripture to read and learn together.

Our Verse(s) of the Month for August is found in Matthew 11:28 – 30. It is:

"Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy and my burden is light."

Jesus is calling us not to take a nap; but to take a break from trying to do it all on our own. We can lay down our fear, our doubt, our burden of self-reliance; and trust Him for help. He is giving us an invitation to let Him carry the load. When we are 'yoked' to Jesus, we can lean on Him and become filled with His Spirit. 
