FROM THE PASTOR

In a world that is increasingly divided, it's easy to fall into the mindset that difference equals division. We see this play out in our communities, workplaces, and even within our churches. But what if the diversity in our thoughts, backgrounds, and perspectives isn't something to fear or resist, but something to celebrate and embrace?

The Apostle Paul, in his letters to the early churches, frequently spoke about the unity of believers in Christ. There were a number of instances of people not agreeing with one another. The first letter to the Corinthians is an attempt to deal with a community that had multiple divisions and conflicts. One of his most profound teachings comes from the twelfth chapter, where he compares the church to the human body. "For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ" (1 Corinthians 12:12). Despite the differences in our gifts, talents, and backgrounds, God has made us one in Christ.

We are not called to sameness and uniformity but to unity. Being different from one another does not mean we must be divided. In fact, it is in our differences that we see the beauty of God's creation. Each person brings something unique to the table, something that enriches the whole community. The challenge is not to erase those differences, but to learn how to appreciate and love one another despite them.

Think of a choir. If every member sang the same note, the music would be dull and lifeless. But when the choir members harmonize, each voice bringing its unique sound, the music becomes rich and beautiful. The same is true of the church. When we allow our differences to come together in unity under the guidance of Christ, we create a harmony that reflects God's glory.

One of the experiences I truly enjoy is saying the Lord's prayer together amongst a mixed group of people. As many know, there are different versions of the spoken Lord's prayer. But whether we individually say "debts," "sins", or "trespasses," we return back to unison as we complete the prayer. We may be different at times, but we can still be unified.

As we move forward, let us remember that the church is not a place where we are all expected to think alike or live alike, but a place where we are called to love alike. Our differences don't have to lead to division. Instead, they offer us the opportunity to build a stronger, more vibrant community in Christ.

Let us pray for hearts that are open to one another, for the courage to embrace our differences, and for the wisdom to know that, in Christ, we are truly one.

Do you hide behind the person in front of you when you hear someone say they are looking for volunteers? Do you try to not make eye contact because you don't want to be asked? Do you not answer the email and pray no one calls you on the phone to ask you to do something you don't feel you have the skills to do? If we are all honest, we can probably raise our hands and admit to doing all three things at some time of our lives.

As many of you know because you have been praying too, my Dad went home to be with the Lord at the end of July and honestly it's been hard. To say that grief makes you question things would be an understatement. I'm not usually one to be so vulnerable in my writing, but going through the loss a loved one changes what you do or don't do anymore.

Having been a member of Central for over 25 years now, I have certainly had the thoughts I expressed to you in the first paragraph. If we are having an honest conversation with ourselves, you probably can admit its been you too! I wanted to share this God-Moment with all of you. I pray that maybe somebody needs to hear it today or at the very least you indulge me for a few minutes!

Back when Dominic and Alydia were in middle school, Don and I were asked to teach the Middler's Sunday School Class. Our first thought was, Us?, Why? We are not scholars, we don't have all the answers, and man... we don't feel equipped. On top of that, the curriculum was called: Can I Ask That? A curriculum designed for kids to ask questions that maybe were not "Church" questions about life, love, and Church. Although we were scared, we kept asking each other: Do you love kids? YES...then do this. So we signed up and it ended up lasting for years until both of our parents were experiencing illnesses and traveling, even on Sundays, was becoming our reality when we stepped down. I actually cried because although I told them how I didn't have all the answers, how sometimes life was challenging for us, we also told the kids if you want some imperfect people who will love you and be there for you...that's us! These kids had become so important to us.

Over the last few years, God has brought us full circle. In PlaySchool Central I have hired two of the girls we taught as Middlers. Here they are teaching me new things about cultures and languages and walking beside me as we communicate to Non-English students and parents at PlaySchool Central. Then, two years ago, when we had to place Don's Dad at a Dementia, long-term care facility, one of the caregivers was another student we had taught in Middle School. I don't know if she even realized how comforting it was to see a familiar face and to know she would help us care for Dad.


Will you continue to pray?

Each year we choose a theme to study or be curious about with our students. As teachers, we strive to keep up with the latest updates in Early Childhood Education and study alongside of our children. They have so much to teach us, if we take the time to listen.


Research into the topic of classroom environments has much to teach us. At PSC, we believe the environment is the third teacher. The materials we choose and how we set up the classroom centers are all specially designed for the children to play, wonder and learn. Light is a way to draw softness and curiosity into our space. Light is a sensorial experience and allows our children to see things from a different perspective. Sometimes we play with light from flashlights, LED candles, the overhead projector and of course the sun that makes our shadows. We invite you along with us this year as we shine some light onto our school journey and explore all the ways light can teach us.

God designed the sunflowers to stretch toward the light as they grow. Sunflowers will be our first topic of study in God's Big Backyard. How does this amazing plant grow? What happens to the seeds? What do living things need to grow? The children will be given materials and see if they can design a sunflower and figure out how to make it stand!

We will also be showing the children how God's Light shines through us as we continue to learn and grow this year. As a staff, we are reflecting how we can shine for God this year and how we can be a light-filled team. Thank you for praying for us and the children.

Having invested 28 years living in Zimbabwe, and numerous visits to Africa, Eastern Europe and several countries in South Asia as a ministry administrator, he has served as a resource person for church conferences and International Leadership training events throughout the world.
